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## <u>Trial HSC Examination Rules and Information</u>

We try to give you the BEST simulation of the HSC in the Trial HSC Examinations. As such, your examinations will be administered by external exam supervisors. Mr Mark Hewitt is the Chief Examination Supervisor and will also oversee your HSC Examinations. He has been in charge of running the HSC Examinations at Belmont High School for the past two years and is an ex Principal.

Please read the following rules and information carefully:

- The timetable is available on Sentral and the school website. A good suggestion is to write up your exams onto a whiteboard and start to prepare your study timetable.
- All exams will be in the school hall, except for the Music examinations, which will be held in J5
   Special provisions and language exams will be in the library.
- Students must wear full school uniform.
- You may only take equipment listed below into the examination room:
  - √ black pens
  - ✓ pencils, erasers and a sharpener (use pencils where specifically directed)
  - ✓ a ruler marked in millimetres and centimetres
  - √ highlighter pens
  - ✓ clear bottle of water labels removed
- Watches must be removed and placed in clear view on your desk. Programmable watches, including smartwatches, will not be allowed in the examination room.
- You must NOT bring any of the following into the examination room:
  - \* mobile phone or smartwatch
  - \* electronic devices (except a calculator where permitted).
  - paper or any printed or written material (including your exam timetable)
  - \* dictionaries, except where permitted in Languages examinations
  - correction fluid or correction tape
- Before each exam, students are to <u>assemble to the side of the HALL (P7)</u> 15 minutes prior to start time and wait for instructions from the Test Supervisor.
- Students must use their NESA student number on all papers, not their name.
- Students are responsible for knowing their student number this will also be provided on your desk
- Students cannot leave the exams early.
- Illness/Misadventure before the exam.
  - ✓ You <u>must attend</u> all exams. If you are not able to sit for the exam/s due to illness or misadventure, you must tell the Chief Exam Supervisor (Mr Hewitt) immediately.
  - ✓ If you are too sick to report to the exam you must ring the school and leave a message.
  - ✓ You must complete an <u>Illness/Misadventure Appeal Form</u>. Evidence of your illness/misadventure must be submitted with your appeal form. If you are sick, you must have a Doctor's certificate.

## • <u>Illness/misadventure during the exam</u>

- ✓ If you are ill or suffer misadventure prior to the test but you are still able to sit the test, please advise the Chief Exam Supervisor **before** the test.
- ✓ If you become ill during the test, tell the exam supervisor.
- Students will only attend school for their exam
- Students may study in the Library, provided they sign in and out at the library.
