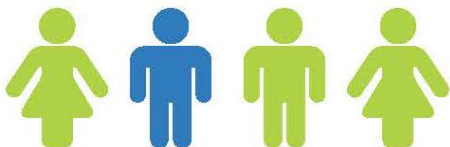

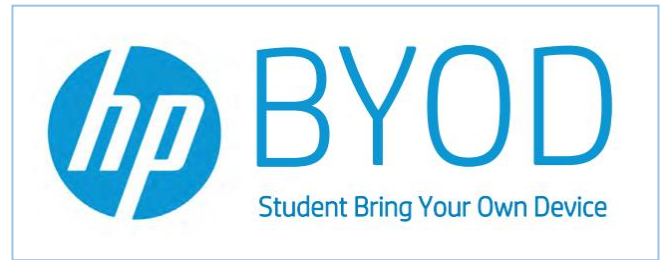

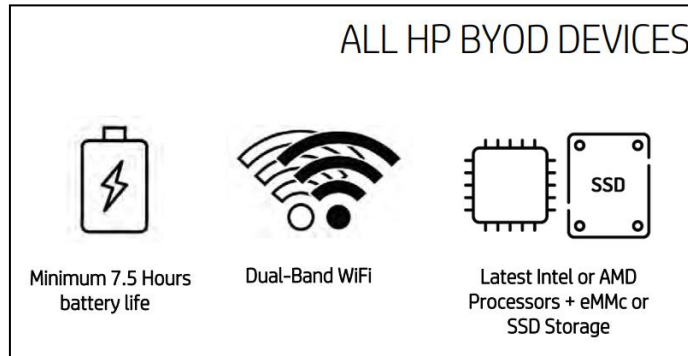


TECHNOLOGY

As part of our BYOD program, Belmont High School have partnered with HP to provide a customised online BYOD store. Buying direct from the store ensures you purchase a product for your child designed to suit the technology requirements of students at BHS and the Department of Education. All devices purchased through the BHS BYOD portal include 3-year onsite support with the option for 3-year Next Business Day Onsite Support and Accidental Damage Protection.



ALL HP BYOD DEVICES



All HP BYOD devices available on the portal have a minimum of 7.5 hours battery life which means the device won't run out of charge throughout the school day.

The portal includes: entry level devices, mid-level devices and high-level devices, as well as accessories. You can also receive an additional 5% discount at checkout by using the eCoupon available on the website. The website sells the same ProBook that we use with the laptop trolleys so you know you are purchasing a quality product.

Thank you to the P&C for their valuable contribution to help with the purchase of 15 HP x360 laptop devices and a new laptop charging trolley to store the devices.

This resource is available to be booked by teachers to utilise in their lessons. The trolley is a welcome addition to our mobile technology resources. The school now has 3 laptop trolleys consisting of 15 devices each and 2 laptop trolleys consisting of 30 devices each.

These trolleys are a wonderful resource for the school and help to supplement students who do not have their own device. They are a limited resource and are in strong demand by teachers wanting to incorporate technology into their lessons and utilise CANVAS - our school's learning management system.

DEPUTY PRINCIPAL'S REPORT – Year 7 and 10

Year 7 Report

Students were recently issued their Year 8 Semester Electives booklet that outlined the subjects available for students to elect to study in Year 8. Year 8 students get to study one elective in Semester 1 and another elective in Semester 2.

All Year 7 students were sent a Web code to their school email address. The email contained a link and web code to make their elective choices online. Students then selected their subjects in order of preference, making their selections online before voting closed on Friday 23 October.

Students will be notified later in the term what electives they have received for 2021.

Year 10 Report

Year 10 are currently in the process of completing their final assessment tasks for each of their subjects to qualify for the Year 10 Record of School Achievement (ROSA). There have been some changes to the assessment schedule provided in the Year 10 Assessment Booklet – Amended Post COVID-19. We are looking forward to a fun term of school Sport in Term 4 to round out a crazy and challenging year!

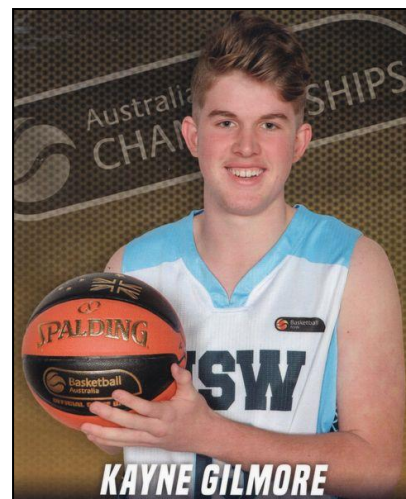
Student Success

Chemist, Vet or Forensic scientist?

Year 8 is a busy year with 3 Science electives on offer! Our students grabbed the opportunity to follow their interest and do some cool activities. The electives Science offer are:



So, you want to be a Vet?

What does a vet's day look like? How do vets and their nurses care for animals? From animal handling and housing, to the various types of pets and their care, students will gain an understanding of the many diseases and treatments involved in keeping our best friends healthy. Practical activities have included injury treatment and medical procedures.

Chemicals in Action!

Chemicals can be calm and polite or violent, reactive and rude.

How can do you tell what will happen? Students have worked with our trained chemist to learn how to test substances to see what's really in them. Practicals have shown how to identify unknown substances requiring their best STEM skills. A study of chemicals that can cause danger will help you appreciate the work of Fire Fighters!



Forensic Science

Our budding Forensic scientists studied and learnt to interpret pieces of evidence from crime scenes.

Methods including fingerprinting, hair and fibre identification, impression investigations and studying maggots or insects to determine time of death were popular. Blood-type analysis using simulated blood and wounds was the most technical while Plaster of Paris casts from shoe impressions required the greatest laboratory precision.

At the end of Year 7 students can choose two of these semester electives for Year 8. They are very popular!

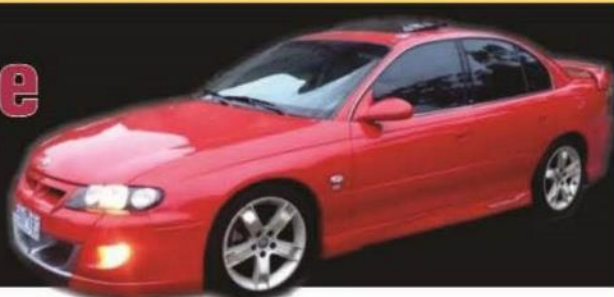
