Parking rules

- Vehicles cannot be parked and left unattended at the end of driveways blocking pedestrian access on footpaths or nature strips.
- Vehicles must park in direction of adjoining traffic at all times.
- You cannot park a vehicle closer than 10 metres from an intersection (20 metres on an intersection with traffic lights) unless otherwise signposted.
- You cannot park vehicles on road-related areas such as footpaths and nature strips.
- Vehicles should park on the road as close as possible to the kerb. Vehicles should not park more than one metre from the kerb.
- On roads without kerb or guttering (including areas with layback kerb and guttering), vehicles should park as close as possible to the edge of the road (where the road meets the grass). Vehicles should not park more than one metre from the edge of the road.
- Vehicles should not park within three metres of a double white line. Vehicles should park on the road as close as possible to the kerb (no more than one metre from kerb and guttering) provided the vehicle is parked more than three metres from the double white lines.
